Quality Assurance Contract Assessor (Part-Time Contract positions)

Are you an Adult or Family Nurse Practitioner (NP) in B.C.? Do you have comprehensive knowledge of CRNBC's Standards of Practice and Quality Assurance Program? Are you familiar with B.C. health legislation and CRNBC bylaws? Do you also have experience and knowledge of prescribing best practices for pain and addictions management? The College of Registered Nurses of British Columbia (CRNBC) is looking for NPs who are interested to participate in supporting the ongoing implementation of CRNBC's NP onsite peer review program. The purpose of CRNBC's QA Program is to support registrants' continuing professional development to maintain competence and achieve high practice standards. These part-time positions involve your participation approximately 6 to 8 days per calendar year.

Who we are:

CRNBC is the regulatory body for close to 40,000 registered nurses, nurse practitioners and licensed graduate nurses in British Columbia. Our purpose is to protect the public by effectively regulating registered nurses and nurse practitioners.

At CRNBC, we believe in integrity, excellence, and accountability. As a member of the team, you can expect to be treated in a respectful and professional manner. While you will occasionally be managing a busy workload, the QA Committee and QA staff support assessors in their work.

What you will be doing:

Assessors who meet selection criteria are appointed by and report to the QA Committee. Assessors assess registrant professional performance and inspect the records, including patient records, of registrants. Assessors work closely with QA staff and the QA Committee and contribute to the development and refinement of Quality Assurance Program policy, procedures and tools.

Responsibilities include:

- Participating in initial and biannual orientation and training with CRNBC to maintain their competence as a QA Contract Assessor
- Conducting registrant interviews and onsite documentation reviews in various locations around BC.
- Completing reports for the QA Committee.
- Contributing to improving CRNBC's Quality Assurance Program.

Your education and skills:

- CRNBC practicing registration in good standing.
- Minimum five years' experience in various areas of clinical practice, including experience managing or leading.
- Minimum three years' experience as an educator and/or preceptor.
- Demonstrated knowledge regarding:
 - Entry level competencies for RNs and NPs;

- CRNBC Standards of Practice, including the Professional Standards, RN and NP Scope of Practice and Practice Standards;
- QA Program related legislation, bylaws, policies and procedures;
- NP streams of practice; and,
- Best practices for prescribing controlled drugs and substances, including opioid agonist therapy.
- Demonstrated skill regarding:
 - Conducting professional performance assessments;
 - Conflict resolution; and,
 - Facilitation/coaching.
- Excellent oral, written and well-developed interpersonal communication skills.
- Working level knowledge and experience using current MS Office tools required. MS CRM Dynamics, and MS SharePoint experience an asset.

Compensation:

Selected candidates will receive payment for assigned days for orientation and completing reviews.
