A baby's birth doesn't always go according to plan. At the Stollery Children's Hospital, the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), a diverse and highly specialized team of pediatric health care professionals works together to provide expert care to infants who are premature or sick, including stabilizing ill infants born in community hospitals across the province.

As a Neonatal Nurse Practitioner (NNP), you provide specialized care and management of neonates. You will have the additional education and training to provide advanced clinical skills, make critical management decisions, and facilitate consistent family-centered care. Collaborating with program staff, attending physicians and specialists, you will acquire and utilize evidence-based best practices and the resources needed to optimize program delivery and adjust care as needed to individual situations.

The NNP participates in program committees, quality improvement programs, leads nursing research initiatives, and provides education to AHS personnel delivering neonate care, including mentorship and preceptorship to new NP's, NP students, and other healthcare providers.

Required Qualifications:

- Active or eligible for registration as a Neonatal Nurse Practitioner with the College and Association of Registered Nurses of Alberta with a practice permit indicating Child population (Neonatal) stream of practice
- Current Basic Cardiac Life Support - Health Care Provider (BCLS-HCP)
- 3 years of full time (or equivalent number of hours) NNP with level III NICU experience

Other key competencies for this role include:

- Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) certification
- Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) certification
- Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) certification
- Quality Improvement certification (i.e. Yellow Belt, Green Belt, Black Belt or equivalent)
- Change Management certification (i.e. PROSCI or equivalent)
- Experience with the development and/or implementation of evidence-based practice
- Experience with program development
